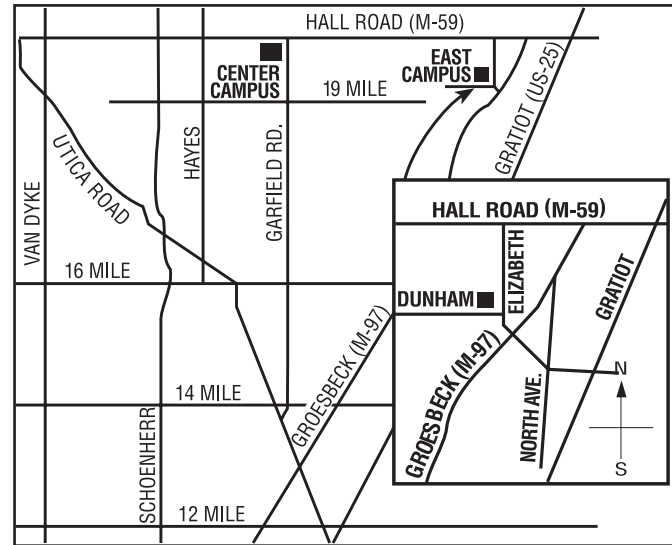
Indoor Firearms Range

The Basic Police Academy, part of Macomb's Criminal Justice Training Center, has over a 35-year tradition of excellence. The Academy is a 17-week, 850 hour training program that exceeds the State of Michigan mandated training curriculum required to enforce the general criminal laws of the State of Michigan. It is recognized throughout the State for producing superior police officers.

Upon graduation from Macomb's Basic Police Academy you will have completed a course of study and skill training that qualifies you to serve with the finest police departments in Michigan and across the U.S.*

Additionally, upon successful completion of the Academy, you will receive 15 college credits. To complete the program, you must have earned an associate's or bachelor's degree.

MCOLES

The Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards

established the basic certification requirements for law enforcement officers in Michigan. Any training facility which offers certification for basic law enforcement officers must be accredited by MCOLES and contracted by them to instruct and certify persons as law enforcement officers.

The minimum requirements are:

- Be a citizen of the United States of America.
- Have attained the minimum age as established by hiring agency which shall not be less than 18 years or as otherwise provided by law.
- Shall have obtained a high school diploma or have attained a passing score on the General Education Development test indicating a high school graduation level.
- Have no prior felony convictions.
- Possess good moral character as determined by a favorable comprehensive background investigation covering school and employment records, home environment, personal traits, and integrity. Consideration will be given to all law violations including traffic and conservation law convictions as indicating lack of good moral character.
- Possess normal hearing, normal color vision, normal visual functions, and acuity in each eye correctable to 20/20. Be free from any other impediment of the senses, physically sound, in possession of all extremities, and well developed physically, with height and weight in proportion to each other as indicated by accepted medical standards.
- Be free from physical defects, chronic diseases, organic diseases, organic functional conditions, or mental or emotional instabilities which may tend to impair the efficient performance of a law enforcement officer's duties or endanger the officer's life or the lives of others.
- Possess a valid Michigan operator's license.
- Successfully complete the Basic Police Training Curriculum.



Agency Candidates

Agencies wishing to have a candidate trained at the Macomb Police Academy must first arrange to have the candidate's name placed on the Academy Request for Seat list. Agencies will then follow up the request for a seat by registering the candidate in the Student Enrollment Section of MITN (MCOLES Information Tracking Network). Seats are reserved for agencies that are members of the Macomb Criminal Justice Training Center first. To reserve a seat, or for more information, call 586.498.4060.

In-Service Candidates

In-service candidates are persons employed by law enforcement agencies for the specific purpose of becoming certified law enforcement officers. These candidates must also pass the MCOLES written and physical agility pre-employment tests to enter the Police Academy. These tests are given at Macomb and various other locations throughout the state. A listing of dates and locations of testing are available by calling 586.498.4060.

Pre-Service Candidates

Once you pass the pre-employment testing and have acquired a minimum of 50 college credit hours from Macomb, you are eligible to make application to the Police Academy as a pre-service (self-sponsored) candidate.

Upon completion of the academy, you can be hired by a Michigan law enforcement agency and certified as a police officer in Michigan.



About the Training Center

Police Academy classes are held at Macomb Community College's East Campus, home to the Emergency Services Training Center.

East Campus is an extraordinary facility where Macomb's Public Service Institute provides a range of educational and training opportunities for police, fire, and emergency medical personnel.
