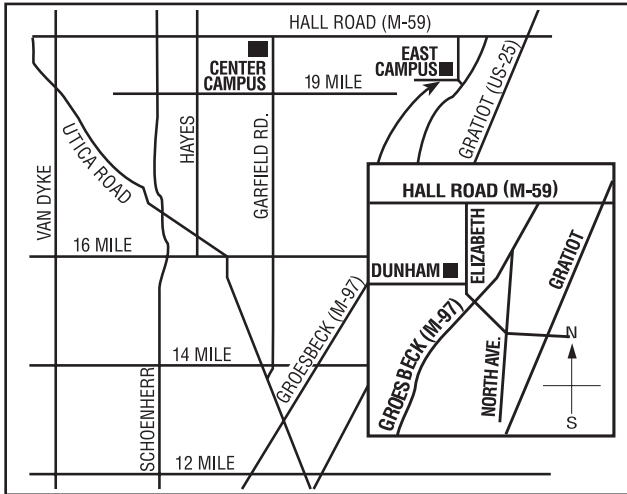

Why Law Enforcement?

Ask most citizens what the foremost problems are facing their community and they will respond "crime and violence." Peace of mind is a precious commodity in today's society. The presence of law enforcement agencies is vital in bringing about that peace of mind.

Law Enforcement as a Career

A career in law enforcement is not for everyone. It's a demanding job, both physically and emotionally. It requires a commitment to justice and a belief in your own ability to positively change your community, state, or nation. It requires the capacity to constructively deal with fear while responsibly helping others through their problems. Many police departments now require that applicants have at least an associate's degree. Graduates of Macomb's Law Enforcement program have found employment in law enforcement agencies at the federal, state and municipal levels. Those graduates who then earned a bachelor's degree have continued to advance in their careers and a number have achieved distinction.



The Program

The program prepares students for entry-level positions in agencies identified with the criminal justice system in the United States as well as offers opportunities to current practitioners for improvement of their skills, knowledge and abilities. The student will develop or improve skills and knowledge of criminal law, current issues in policing, evidence and criminal procedures and investigation, as well as other facets of law enforcement.

Options

Students in the program have the option of obtaining an Associate of Applied Science degree (minimum of 62 credit hours), or a Certificate in Law Enforcement (27 credit hours).

In addition, upon successful completion of Macomb's Basic Police Academy, students will receive 12 college credits. To complete the Academy program students must have earned an associate's or bachelor's degree.

The Basic Police Academy is a 16-week, 680-hour training program that exceeds the State of Michigan mandated training curriculum required to enforce the general criminal laws of the State of Michigan. It is recognized throughout the country for producing superior police officers.

The Faculty

The faculty of Macomb's Law Enforcement program know first hand the realities and legalities of police work. The instructors are all current or former law enforcement officers, many with command experience, and all with advanced degrees in the criminal justice field.



Beyond The Degree...

Advanced Police Training

At the Macomb Criminal Justice Training Center, located on the East Campus, practicing police officers may take individual classes to advance their skills or prepare for promotions. Additionally, the Center for Police Management and Leadership Studies is an executive-level training program designed for police officers intent on earning the highest rank in their departments and those who have already achieved rank. The program is held once a year at Macomb's East Campus.

Advanced Degree Options

Those students planning to transfer credits earned at Macomb to a four-year college should see a counselor at the university they are planning to attend as early as possible in their college career.
