



**Section 4: Domestic Relations Mediation** **LEGL-8016**

Prerequisite: Basic Mediation or Juris Doctorate

SCAO approved training (MCR 3.216). Theory and content is balanced with skill building tools that are applied in a domestic relations and divorce mediation practice. Mediation process: techniques, conflict management, power balancing, ethics and standards of practice, domestic violence and court process. Topics include: family mediation theory, emotional issues, communication skills, children’s issues in divorce, parenting arrangements, property division, support, tax implications, pension and other financial concerns. (7 sessions)

**Section 5: Domestic Violence Screening Protocol** **LEGL-8017**

Prerequisite: Basic Mediation, Domestic Relations Mediation

SCAO approved training (MCR 3.216). Understand the appropriateness of mediation as it relates to domestic abuse and child neglect. Topics include: nature and dynamics of abuse, violence theory, emotional issues, communication skills, domestic violence screening protocol, special mediation process and techniques, balancing of power, personal protection orders and no contact orders, safe termination of mediation and confidentiality. This course is a requirement to participate as a qualified domestic relations mediator. (1 session)

**Section 6: Arbitration** **LEGL-8018**

Prerequisite: General Civil Mediation

Gain insights and specific techniques to conduct an effective arbitration hearing and render a timely award. Topics include: the process of case intake to award, current applicable arbitration protocol, legal and ethical issues in arbitration, challenges that arbitrators confront, due process protocols, navigating challenges to the arbitral award, preserving neutrality, control of the arbitration process, power of the arbitrator, maintaining control and setting the tone. (4 sessions)
