

Articulation Agreement
between
Macomb Community College
and
Macomb Community College's Public Service Institute

This Agreement, made this 28th day of June, 2010, by and between Macomb Community College and Macomb Community College's Public Service Institute.

WHEREAS, the parties wish and intend by the Agreement to set forth the terms and conditions of engaging in an educational program to help eligible participating students continue their education toward an Associate Degree in the Emergency Medical Services Program, or the Fire Science Program.

Macomb Community College and Macomb Community College's Public Service Institute agree that students whom successfully complete the Fire Service Career Academy and meet the following requirements will receive select credit in the Emergency Medical Services Program (EMSA) or the Fire Science (FIRE) Program at Macomb Community College.

1. Student must successfully complete Macomb Community College's Fire Service Career Academy and have an overall high school GPA of 2.0.
2. Student must enroll in the Emergency Medical Services Program (EMSA) or the Fire Science program (FIRE) at MCC within 4 years of high school graduation.
3. Course credit will be added to the student's transcript upon successful completion of 6 semester hours of Emergency Medical Services (EMSA) or Fire Science (FIRE) courses and the payment of a service fee (\$5.00 as of the date of this agreement). Regular tuition and fees for credit granted under this agreement will be waived.
4. Applicants for credit must meet all college admission requirements and be an enrolled/registered student in good standing.

Upon completion of the Fire Service Career Academy and 6 semester hours of (EMSA) or (FIRE) courses in the Emergency Medical Services Program or the Fire Science Program at Macomb Community College, the student meeting these requirements will receive 2 semester hours of elective credit towards their Associate Degree in Emergency Medical Services Program or the Fire Science program.

These departments of Macomb Community College agree to communicate concerning curriculum changes which affect the agreed upon relationships between articulated courses.

The Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties, and all prior discussions, agreements, and understandings, whether verbal or in writing, are hereby merged into this Agreement.

No agreement or modification to this Agreement, including any amendment or modification of this paragraph, shall be effective unless the same is in writing and signed by all parties.

This agreement expires June 30, 2012.
