- Transfer credit limits vary by each transfer college and major. This transfer guide may contain more than the maximum number of allowable transfer credits Detroit Mercy will accept.
- Macomb and Detroit Mercy reserve the right to make any necessary changes to courses, provisions, or transfer requirements without notice.
- It is the responsibility of the student to be aware of changes that affect their transfer program. Students are strongly encouraged to contact Detroit Mercy on an annual basis to review their program requirements.
- Students may concurrently be enrolled and taking courses at both Macomb and Detroit Mercy during the same semester after completing the minimum requirements for Detroit Mercy. Meet with a Detroit Mercy advisor for additional information.
