What Is CLEP?

The College Board's College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) offers exams that cover college-level subjects typically seen in introductory courses.

The College Board's website provides additional information about CLEP exams, including exam descriptions and test preparation resources: clep.collegeboard.org.

Who Is It For?

In short, almost anyone! According to the CLEP website, anyone over the age of 13 can sit for a CLEP exam, so long as they are located in the U.S. (not in U.S. Territories) or funded by DANTES. This may include:

- · Students—college or high school
- · Military-affiliated service members and veterans
- Adult learners returning to college
- Professionals seeking continuing education credits

Contact your academic advisor or the Learning Center's testing room to discuss whether CLEP is right for you.

What Does It Do For Me?

By earning a qualifying score (see back for details), you can receive credit for courses that are part of your degree program. This, in turn, helps you get through your programs faster and at a lower cost.

How Do I Sign Up?

- 1. Visit clep.collegeboard.org to sign in to your College Board account or create one. Once logged in, register for a CLEP exam online.
- 2. After you complete registration, make an appointment at our test center. For information on office hours and test dates, please visit our website or search for "CLEP" on macomb.edu.
- 3. Before the day of your exam, you should expect to pay two fees via Acceptiva (https://secure.acceptiva. com/?cst=4vWFAT). See below for details.

Military service members and veterans:

CLEP fees are waived for military-affiliated individuals who qualify for DANTES funding.

Military personnel must present military ID at the time of the exam. Please check the CLEP website for eligibility requirements (clep.collegeboard.org/clep-military-benefits) or contact Macomb's Veterans and Military Services department.

What Can I Expect?

On the Day of the Exam

Please print and bring your registration ticket along with your driver's license, passport or other government-issued identification that includes your photograph and signature. A proctor will ask you to show your ticket and identification to be admitted to the testing area. The last name(s) on your ID must match the name on your registration ticket.

Cell phones, calculators, tablets, smart watches, books, papers and food are not allowed in the testing room. A calculator is provided if your exam requires you to use one. Each exam lasts approximately two hours. Candidates with disabilities who require accommodations must make arrangements at least one week in advance of the test date.

CLEP Policies

There is no limit to the number of CLEP examination credit hours that a student can earn at Macomb. We advise that you speak with the Counseling & Academic Advising department to consider how your credits apply to your program and graduation requirements.

Once you finish the exam, you have two options for your score:

- 1. View the score and report it to the College Board.
- 2. Delete the score without seeing it or reporting it.

Students cannot retake an exam until after three months from the testing date. However, exams in other subjects can be taken at any time.

Rescheduling

If you are unable to take your exam, call or email the testing room to reschedule your appointment as soon as possible.
