**Important Information:**

1. Exploratory Requirement: Students with majors in the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) must satisfy an exploratory requirement. This can be done by completing a double major or a CAS minor or concentration; or by completing a minimum of 12 credits in a single CAS rubric, outside of their major rubric. Students using MTA or MACRAO must complete the exploratory requirement at Oakland University or another four-year institution.
2. All content is for informational purposes and is designed to be used as a tool to assist students with transfer information but should not be used for self-advising. Some courses may include prerequisite requirements that are not listed in this guide. Consult with your advisor for details.
3. When pursuing a Macomb degree work closely with a Macomb and Oakland University advisor or counselor to ensure BOTH the Macomb and Oakland University degree requirements are being met.
4. Macomb and Oakland University reserve the right to make any necessary changes to courses, provisions, or transfer requirements without notice.
5. It is the responsibility of the student to be aware of changes that affect their transfer program. Students are strongly encouraged to contact Oakland University on an annual basis to review their program requirements.
6. Students may concurrently be enrolled and taking courses at both Macomb and Oakland University during the same semester after completing the minimum requirements for Oakland University. Meet with an academic advisor or counselor for additional information.
7. If you decide to transfer before graduating from Macomb you may be eligible to earn your associate degree after the fact.
