3. Transfer credit limits vary by each transfer college and major. This transfer guide may contain more than the maximum number of allowable transfer credits University of Detroit Mercy will accept.
4. Macomb and University of Detroit Mercy reserve the right to make any necessary changes to courses, provisions, or transfer requirements without notice.
5. It is the responsibility of the student to be aware of changes that affect their transfer program. Students are strongly encouraged to contact University of Detroit Mercy on an annual basis to review their program requirements.
6. Students may concurrently be enrolled and taking courses at both Macomb and University of Detroit Mercy during the same semester after completing the minimum requirements for University of Detroit Mercy. Meet with an academic advisor or counselor for additional information.
8. Course grades must be a 'C' or better to transfer in to University of Detroit Mercy's HSA program.
9. If you decide to transfer before graduating from Macomb you may be eligible to earn your associate degree after the fact.
