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<p>General Education Requirements: Note: This program follows the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA). Students who complete the MTA will satisfy most general education requirements for Western Michigan University. Students who do not receive the MTA endorsement must still satisfy all general education requirements for Western Michigan University.
