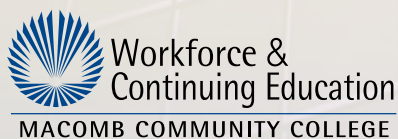

When people are talking fast, court reporters are there to capture the spoken word verbatim. With a keen ear for conversation combined with the training and skills to ensure every word is transcribed correctly, court reporters play a vital role in making sure important information gets recorded accurately. Court reporters might work in an actual courtroom and document legal proceedings, travel to lawyer or doctor offices and take depositions, or work from home and provide television closed captioning among other opportunities. This high-demand field is often limited only by how much a court reporter wants to work.

That gives tremendous credibility to our certificate-holders, who are employment-ready the moment they leave the program and complete the national and state-required exams (which we help you prepare for). And it's much more affordable than many online programs.

We help students "learn the language" of court reporting with practical skill-building using a stenograph machine. Basic mechanics grow into speed-building exercises and advanced vocabulary practice. By the end of the two-and-a-half-year program, you will be prepared to take the national speed requirements to obtain your license and write any word someone says at the speed needed to gain a job in the field.

Employment Outlook

With this certificate, you will be qualified for careers including court reporter (freelance possibilities), closed captioner and CART writer. Median salary for these careers in Michigan is \$43,070 with 1 percent growth in openings expected through 2024.
