### Who takes International and Global Studies at Macomb?

Nikola Bulajic did. A native of the former Yugoslavia, Bulajic was accepted into a foreign exchange program while a student at Macomb and studied in Germany for 10 months. Then, after graduating in 2009, he took a year off—sort of. A trip across the U.S. on his Kawasaki KLR 650 was preceded by 10 months in Brazil on a prestigious scholarship, of which he was only one of three community college students in the nation to receive. “I love the language and culture of Brazil,” he said. “It had been my lifelong dream to go there, and I am so glad that, through Macomb, I had the chance to do it.”
